- Part 2: Birmingham, Ala. & New York City (USA)
Sat. July 21st – Sat. August 4th, 2018*
- Preparatory meeting in Birmingham, Ala.:
Sat. March 17th, 2018

Who can apply?

- Current or alumni members of a local youth council, youth parliament, or youth advisory board located in Georgia or Alabama
- Age: 16 to 20

How much is it?

- Participation fee: \$600 USD (including all flights, insurance, board and lodge, activities and excursions)
- Your additional fundraising goal: \$500 USD per participant
- The majority of the project's costs will be financed by the Transatlantic Program of the Federal Republic of Germany.
